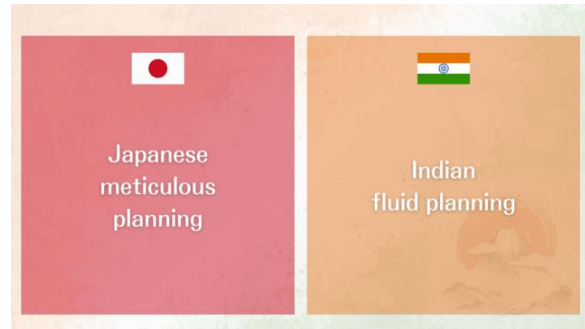


“Culture of Japanese Company for

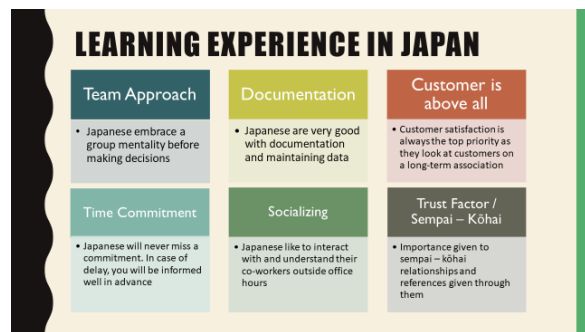


“Corporate Culture in
