Bonsai Trees by Mrs. G.Suchitha Reddy, Friends Bonsai Society



The art of dwarfing trees or plants by growing and trimming them in containers according to prescribed techniques is called Bonsai. The Bonsai literally means "tray planting" was introduced in Japan in 13th Century.

Most Bonsai Trees range in heights from 5cm to 1m. Trees used, are evergreen varieties and in Japan Pine, Bamboo and Plum. Well cared Bonsai can live for hundred of years and are passed from Generation to Generation.

Major styles include the upright slanting, cascading the twisting-trunk styles clumped, forest style and rock planting styles.

Japanese Martial Arts performed by Professionals
